

South Coast AQMD Issues a Windblown Dust Advisory for the Coachella Valley

Valid Monday 2:00 AM until Tuesday 9:00 AM

Current Conditions

• Air Quality Index (AQI) levels at Whitewater Wash area, Palm Springs and Indio have been **Good** to **Moderate** from Saturday afternoon to Sunday afternoon.

Forecasted Air Quality Impacts

 Persistent high winds are forecasted in the Coachella Valley from 2 AM Monday through 9 AM Tuesday.

- High winds can lead to windblown dust; gusts up to 51 miles per hour are expected in the Western Coachella Valley.
- Windblown dust is expected to cause AQI values to reach **Unhealthy** or worse in the Coachella Valley on Monday.
- AQI levels will vary over time and by location depending on wind speed and direction.

Detailed Forecast

Monday morning	Strong wind gusts and elevated levels of windblown dust are expected, which may lead to AQI levels reaching Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups or higher during this period.
Monday daytime	AQI levels may worsen to Unhealthy or higher as winds strengthen.
Monday night and Tuesday morning	AQI levels may improve to Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups or better as winds die down.

South Coast AQMD will issue an update if additional information becomes available.

If you are in an area impacted by windblown dust or ash:

- Limit your exposure by remaining indoors with windows and doors closed or seeking alternate shelter.
- Avoid vigorous physical activity.
- Run your air conditioning and/or an air purifier. If possible, do not use swamp coolers or whole house fans that bring in outside air.
- Help minimize dust pollution by stabilizing loose soils and slowing down if driving on dirt roads.
