Purpose of This Meeting

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) has scheduled a Public Consultation Meeting to present and solicit information and suggestions from the public on Proposed Amended Rule 1111 – Reduction of NOx Emissions from Natural-Gas-Fired Furnaces (PAR 1111) and Proposed Amended Rule 1121 – Reduction of NOx Emissions from Residential-Type, Natural-Gas-Fired Water Heaters (PAR 1121). A Public Workshop was conducted on October 3, 2024, for the original rule proposal and based on information and suggestions, the rule proposals have been revised. PAR 1111 and PAR 1121 are scheduled for a Public Hearing before the South Coast AQMD Governing Board on May 2, 2025 (subject to change).

Background

Rule 1111 was adopted in December 1978 and regulates oxides of nitrogen (NOx) emissions from natural gas-fired furnaces with rated heat input capacity of less than 175,000 British thermal units (Btu) per hour, or for units with combined heating and cooling (package units), a cooling rate of less than 65,000 Btu per hour. PAR 1111 seeks further NOx emission reductions from space heating appliances and implement the 2022 Air Quality Management Plan (AQMP) Control Measure R-CMB-02 – Emission Reductions from Replacement with Zero Emission.

Rule 1121 was adopted in December 1978 and regulates NOx emissions from natural gas-fired water heaters with a rated heat input capacity of less than 75,000 Btu per hour. PAR 1121 seeks further NOx emission reductions and implements the 2022 AQMP Control Measure R-CMB-01 – Emission Reductions from Replacement with Zero Emission or Low NOx Appliances – Residential Water Heating.

Objectives of Proposed Amended Rules

PAR 1111 and PAR 1121 propose zero-NOx emission limits for new space and water heating appliance installations based on future effective dates, with compliance dates differentiated for units installed in new or existing buildings. The proposed amended rules include an alternative compliance option applicable to manufacturers which establishes zero-NOx emission space and water heating appliance sales targets that increase over time, paired with a mitigation fee. The proposed amended rules also specify certification, labeling, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements; removes outdated provisions; and exempts space and water heating appliances from zero-NOx emission requirements when installed in master-metered mobile home parks and in existing mobile homes. PAR 1111 also sunsets the alternative compliance option for mobile home furnaces and establishes a NOx emission limit of 40 nanograms per joule.
